DO YOUR PART Kevin Beard

It has been said that in the church's work, ninety percent of the work is accomplished by 10 percent of the members. How literally accurate this may be is not apparent. However, the concept that a minority of the people do a majority of the work seems to be pretty accurate in many cases. How do you think the Lord looks at this?

Paul compared the church to a body in which each member has unique qualities that contribute to the overall benefit of the body (Romans 12:3-8). His intention was to end the kind of proud attitude that elevates oneself and belittles others: "For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith" (Romans 12:3). Realizing that we are all members of the body with something to contribute to the good of the body should prevent arrogance.

However, there is another problem that this passage can help to overcome. Sometimes people do not get involved in doing the work that needs to be done. Maybe they think they have little to offer, or maybe they think they are busier than other church members, or maybe they just want to be served instead of being servants themselves. Paul said, "For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually, members of one another" (Romans 12:4-5). If every member has unique properties to offer toward the good of the body as a whole, what happens when you do not contribute what you have? The body suffers.

Let's not sit idly by while a few do most of the work. Let's realize that God has given all of us something that we can do and put those talents to use for His glory and for the good of the whole body of Christ!
