- I. Philip was a man who was found (John 1:43).**
- A. It is evident that Jesus was looking for him.
  - B. Jesus is looking for everyone (1 Timothy 2:3-4).
  - C. Philip was also looking for Jesus.
  - D. Too many of us are not engaged in this effort.
  - E. Sometimes we search in the wrong places or not at all.
- II. Philip was a man who was on fire (John 1:45-46).**
- A. Philip went and found Nathaniel.
  - B. The best answer we can give someone is “come and see.”
  - C. With this attitude, we have the zeal we are commanded to have.
  - D. Sadly, many have lost this trait.
  - E. Everything starts in the home.
- III. Philip was a man who faltered (John 6:5-7; 12:20-22; 14:6-10).**
- A. Jesus tested Philip to see what his thinking was.
  - B. We don’t know why Philip did not take the Greeks straight to Jesus himself.
  - C. Can you imagine the hurt in the voice of Jesus?
  - D. Distraction may be Satan’s greatest weapon.
  - E. We must remember that we are engaged in the greatest work of all time.
- IV. Philip was a man who was faithful (Acts 1:12-13; 2:14).**
- A. Philip did not quit when he faltered.
  - B. This is the true measure of a person.
  - C. How we react to adversity is a barometer of our faith.
