WHAT SHALL I DO THEN WITH JESUS? (Matthew 27:19-25)

I. Who has to answer this question.

- A. This is a question that must be answered by every accountable person.
- B. This is a personal question: "What shall I do...?"
 - 1. I can't answer it for you.
 - 2. You can't answer it for me.
- C. No one is immune from this question who comes to a state where right and wrong is understood and realizes that wrongs have been committed by him/her.
- D. Each of us is responsible for how we live (2 Corinthians 5:10).
- E. Christians need to understand that we must continually answer this question as well.
 - 1. Every day to which we wake up we make a decision about what we will do with Jesus that day.
 - 2. We decide that we will continue with Him or turn our backs on Him.
 - 3. We must examine ourselves (2 Corinthians 13:5).
 - 4. We are to continually confess Him before men (Matthew 10:32-33), which is done by the way we live our lives.

II. How some have answered this question.

- A. Many people about whom we read in the New Testament had the opportunity to answer this question with Jesus in front of them.
- B. It is interesting to see how some of them answered.
- C. The Gadarenes asked Jesus to leave their area of the country.
 - 1. Jesus had healed a man that had lived among the tombs who was inhabited by numerous demons.
 - 2. When the demons were cast out they went into a herd of swing that was nearby and the herd charged into the ocean.
 - 3. When the countrymen came to the site, they asked Jesus to leave (Luke 8:37).
 - 4. They had the Son of God in their midst and wanted Him to leave.
 - 5. There are those that are studied with or do their own study and when presented with the truth ask you to leave or quit studying.
- D. The mob present at the trial of Jesus cried out, "Let Him be crucified!" (Matthew 27:22-23).
 - 1. They wanted nothing to do with Jesus.
 - 2. Many are like that today and some of His own people crucify Him afresh by turning from Him (Hebrews 6:6).
- E. Pilate chose to wash hands of the matter (Matthew 27:24).

- 1. Pilate tried to take a position of neutrality.
- 2. This is not an option because we are either for or against Jesus (Matthew 12:30).
- F. Judas betrayed Jesus (Matthew 26:47-49).
 - 1. One who had been with Jesus for a long time betrayed Him.
 - 2. Sad it is to see those saints who have been long time with Jesus, for some reason, turn their back on Him.
- G. Peter denied Him but later repented (Matthew 26:72).
 - 1. At times, most of us deny the Lord in some way.
 - 2. Thankfully, many of us that do that see the sin we have committed and repent of it.
- H. Paul counted all things loss for Christ.
 - 1. Here was a man who was on the fast track to success in the Jews religion.
 - 2. For Christ, Paul willingly turned his back on all that he knew and lived for Jesus (Philippians 3:7; 1:20-21).
 - 3. This allowed him to write some marvelous words to Timothy (2 Timothy 4:6-8).

III. The question will one day be reversed.

- A. There is coming a day of judgment (Acts 17:30-31).
 - 1. On that day we will be judged by the words of Jesus (John 12:48).
 - 2. We will be judged by how we lived in our bodies in accordance with those words (2 Corinthians 5:10).
- B. Right now, Jesus is knocking at the door of our hearts wanting to come in and to stay in (Revelation 3:20).
- C. On the day of judgment, Jesus will turn the question around on us: "What shall I do with you" will be asked us by Jesus.
- D. How we answered the question posed in this sermon will determine how Jesus answers His question on the judgment day.
